The International Organization ISO is called upon to be held liable for an international offense in violation of the obligations of mandatory rules of international law *erga omnes* due to its lack of prompt availability in ensuring the enjoyment of rights to the Veneto People in accordance with the present Agreements, International Agreement relating to the rights civil and political rights and the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, which reads:

Part one

Article 1

1. All peoples have the right to self-determination. By virtue of this right, they freely decide on their political status and freely pursue their economic, social and cultural development.

2. To achieve their ends, all peoples can freely dispose of their wealth and natural resources, without prejudice to the obligations deriving from international economic cooperation, based on the principle of mutual interest, and by international law. Under no circumstances may a people be deprived of their means of subsistence.

The Juridical-Legal Council of the Veneto People, configures and equates the decision of the International Criminal Court to prosecute environmental crimes, such as crimes against humanity and genocide, with very serious violations of international humanitarian law extended and systematic attack against the civilian population of Veneto, if deprived of their means of subsistence.

Acts qualifying as crimes against humanity by the Rome Statue;

Art. 7 Crimes against humanity

1. For the purposes of this Statute, a crime against humanity means any of the following acts, when committed as part of a widespread or systematic attack against civilian populations, and with awareness of the attack:

a) Homocide;

b) Extermination;

c) Enslavement;

e) Imprisonment or other serious forms of deprivation of personal liberty in violation of fundamental norms of international law;

h) Persecution against an identity group or community for political, racial, national, ethnic, cultural, religious or gender reasons within the meaning of paragraph 3, or for other reasons universally recognized as inadmissible within the meaning of international law, related to acts covered by the provisions of this paragraph or to crimes within the jurisdiction of the Court;

j) Crime of apartheid;

k) Other inhuman acts of a similar nature intended to intentionally cause great suffering or serious damage to physical integrity or to physical or mental health.

2. For the purposes of paragraph 1:

g) "persecution" means the intentional and severe deprivation of fundamental rights in violation of international law, for reasons related to the identity of the group or collectivity;

Acknowledged: 23 Dec 2013 - The Venetian language is recognized with the identifier ISO 639-3 "vec" by UNESCO, classified among the living languages in the Ethnologue catalog and recognized by the Council of Europe in 1981.

Considering economic, social and cultural rights are human rights in the social and economic fields, such as the right to education, the right to housing, the right to an adequate standard of living, the right to health and the right to science and to culture.

Who we are: International legal personality

The Veneto National Liberation Committee, in compliance with the provisions contained in Art. 96.3 of the 1st additional protocol of 1977, to the Geneva Conventions of 1949. Art. 96.3 of the First Geneva Protocol of 1977 on Liberation Movements, in order to relate with third States, the Institutional Government Apparatus was issued: National Council of the Veneto People (Venetian National Authority - A.N.V.) and notified its foundation by delivering the Constitutive Act, with signatures of the founders, at the headquarters of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) in Geneva (CH), on 25/07/2016 to be notified to the Secretary General of the United Nations. The Provisional Veneto Legal System is the reference legal instrument adopted by the Provisional Veneto Government for the management of the transition phase. Every Citizen of the Veneto People has the right and the power to delegate the provisional administration of the Veneto State to the Provisional Veneto Government, established pursuant to and by effect of article 96.3 of the 1st Geneva Protocol of 1977, recognizing it as the sole authority, legally established, on the occupied territories of its Patria Naturalis Ratio. For free, informed and democratic choice, in order to perfect our Union, to secure justice, to secure domestic tranquillity, to provide for the common defence, to promote the general welfare, to safeguard for ourselves and our posterity the good of liberty, we implement all the rights of self-determination of peoples with direct democracy, the Federal Constitution of the Venetian Confederation. The Veneto National Liberation Committee is organized and represents the entire Veneto People and 14,581 people, self-determined Venetian citizens of the "Veneto National Liberation Committee", participate in international social life: it has the ability to conclude agreements, take part in the work of international organizations and participates in international conferences, presents international complaints and requests, leads the fight to realize the right to self-determination.
